Food Justice Committee Meeting Minutes October 3, 2018

In Attendance: Eric, Norman, Jeannine, Seth, Kentu, Alexis, Flo, Jack, Jon, Denise, Megan, Cait, Seth.

1. Approval of September meeting minutes.

The minutes were approved.

2. Announcements

Announcements were incorporated into the rest of the meeting, and were not a single separate topic of discussion.

- 3. General discussion, led by Eric.
 - a. Eric summarized the last meeting at the WW Farm / Henry Got Crops. One specific topic of interest at that meeting was formation of a task force / subcommittee focused on improving the food-for-all program at WW. The task force met on Sept 25, and is currently attempting to defnie their focus and scope. The next meeting will be at 6 p.m. on October 22, at Nexus.

One particular idea raised by the task force is an "affordable dinner program" modeled after a "\$20 dinners" program at a nearby store. There was some discussion about recipes, and questions about how to integrate the idea with the three WW stores, including the \$4 dinner program at the Ambler store. Jon mentioned a cookbook called "Good and Cheap" by Leanne Brown. The cookbook is specifically designed around the idea of a low-cost, healthy diet costing approximately \$4 per person per day.

Jeannine, Cait and Jon volunteered to make dishes of their choosing that meet the "affordable dinner" < \$20 / 4 people guideline for the next FJC meeting.

Eric is seeking volunteers, as well as suggestions for the name of the program.

- There was some discussion of the importance of registering to vote, and of voting. The registration deadline is the Thursday after the October FJC meeting.
- c. The UUH is sponsoring a holiday food drive, and is seeking sites where they can locate their food collection boxes. The relevant information is in the attached handout, brought to the FJC meeting by Jack.

- d. Eric raised the possibility of getting a group together to do produce rescue through Philabundance this fall. Produce rescue would most likely occur on a Friday between 8:30 and 12:30.
- e. Various FJC members inquired about the status of the lay-of-the-land project. Some liaisons have been very active with the groups they signed up to interact with, other liasons have been less active. Lay-of-the-land liaisons are encouraged to contact Mimi about their experience prior to the November meeting, at which there may be further discussion of the current status of the lay-of-the-land project.
- f. There was brief discussion of the federal government's large influx of food to food pantries across the country. Jack will ask Mimi to re-send the article she sent out about this topic, for potential discussion at the November FJC meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 7 p.m.
